MEMORANDUM FOR All Current and Retired North Carolina National Guardsmen

SUBJECT: Correction Enterprises Benefits Eligibility

- 1. Governor Roy Cooper recently signed House Bill 120 into law that makes National Guard members and retirees immediately eligible to save hundreds of dollars on the purchase of items like eyeglasses, clothing, metal grills and fire pits, printing and furniture from Correction Enterprises, a division of the NC Dept. of Public Safety (NCDPS). For example, a pair of prescription glasses often costs \$400-\$600 or more at a retailer but is priced at under \$200 from Correction Enterprises' Optical Dept.
